We offer **IGCSEs** and **A Levels** alongside **Akademeia Assessed Courses**, which supplement and go beyond the prescribed UK Examination Boards' curricula. In Years 10 and 11 students take interdisciplinary Akademeia Assessed Courses and iGCSEs subjects. All students at Akademeia High School work towards A Level exams in Years 12 and 13.

In **Year 11** students take 4 core iGCSEs and combine these with 1 of the 6 academic pathways and 1 additional subject.

In **Year 12** students select 3 to 4 A Level subjects from across 6 faculties. All Polish citizens take Polish as an additional A Level.

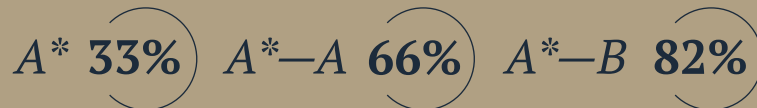

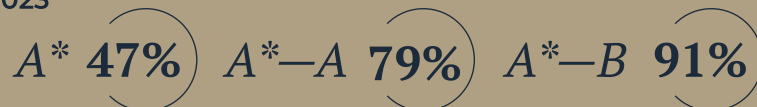
A Levels Results

A Levels Grading Scale

GPA and ranking are not calculated

- ◆ **Internal exams** are administered for all non-creative arts subjects in Terms 1 and 2
- ◆ **Modular subjects** are assessed by external AS Levels in Term 3
- ◆ **Linear subjects** are assessed through internal coursework in Term 3
- ◆ **Creative Arts** are assessed through internal coursework in Terms 1 and 2 and with internal exams in Term 3
- ◆ **Modular AS exams** (administered externally in the end of Y12) are reported via official results and may earn the maximum mark of an A

Y12

- ◆ **All linear and modular subjects** are internally assessed in Terms 1 and 2; students sit their A Level external exams in May and June of Y13
- ◆ **Midterm grades** are calculated according to EOT1 exams and coursework
- ◆ The American **grading scale** corresponds to the British in the following way:
A / A*, A; B / B; C / C; D / D, E; F / U

- ◆ **Co-curricular activities** are assessed according to participation and attendance on the following scale: Distinction, Merit, Pass, Fail

Personal Development Scheme

The Personal Development Scheme provides students with **an opportunity for self-discovery and personal development**. Students must develop and complete one project in Year 12 and another in Year 13 from two of the following three categories: **academic** (i.e. conferences + competitions), **professional** (i.e. internships or summer work experiences), or **community engagement**.
